Graduates of Oxford Saïd Business School's Masters in Financial Economics Programme continue to perform well in what remains a challenging economic environment, particularly for the banking industry. 82% of the class accepted an offer within 3 months of graduation and found employment at organisations in 16 countries around the world. Most of these secured roles in the free trade countries of Europe (43%) and in Asia (43%) reflecting the nationality make-up of the class.

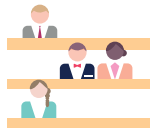
Investment Banking and Asset Management continue to be the destinations of choice but the percentage of students finding jobs in Consulting remains steady at 12.5%. It is especially pleasing to note that our students continue to be attractive to the biggest global names in Finance and that employers are extending multiple offers in multiple locations. For example, 9 of this year's class were offered roles at Morgan Stanley in London, New York, and Hong Kong.

Mean salaries for the class remain competitive at £43,940.

In response to both our students' and employers' needs, our MFE programme has supported our students' personal development journeys and these employment outcomes. The combination of our MFE curriculum and co-curricular programmes – for example, the Oxford Saïd Finance Lab, continue to provide a rich and relevant learning experience for our students. I would like to thank the global employers and Oxford community we partner with, who invest time and resources to hire and develop our talented students, participants and alumni across our programmes.

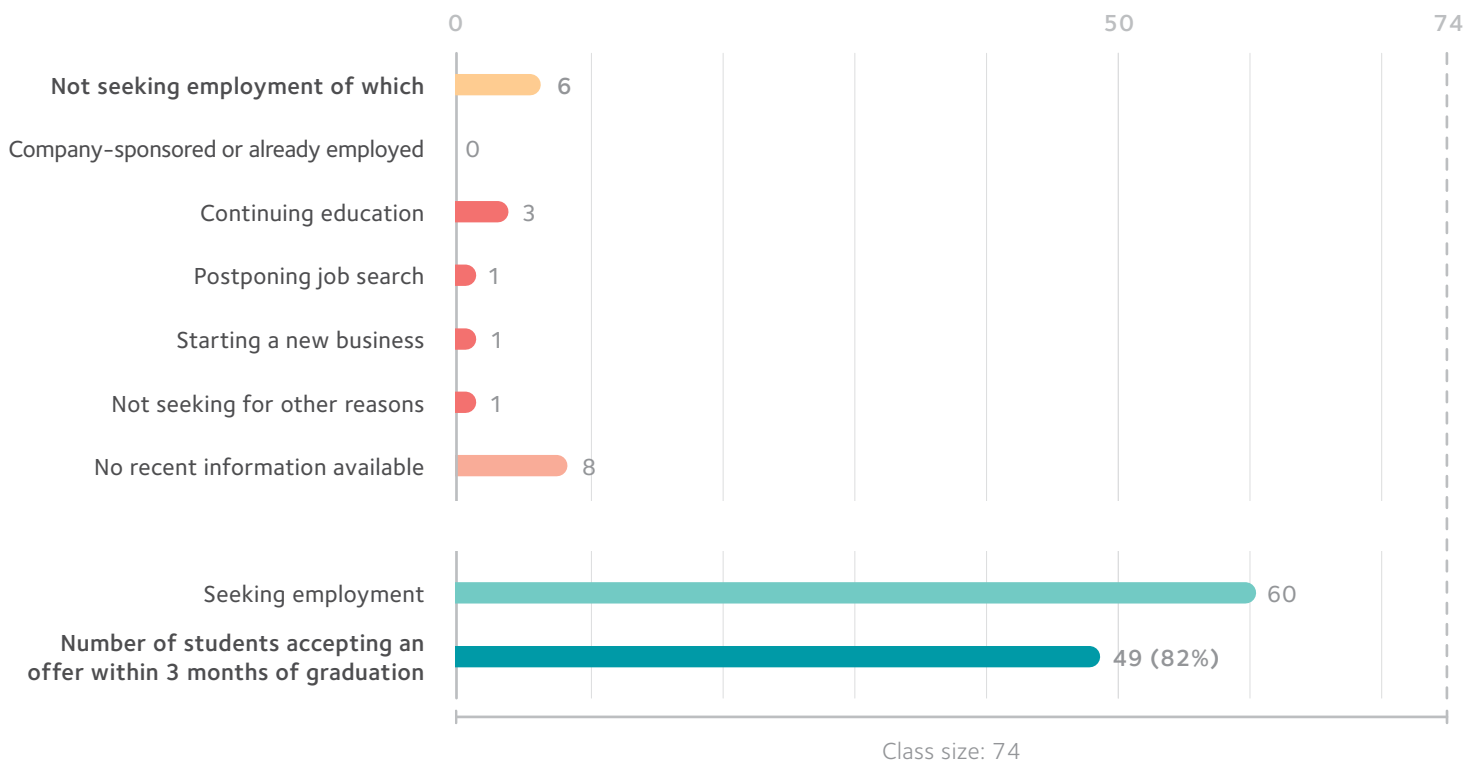

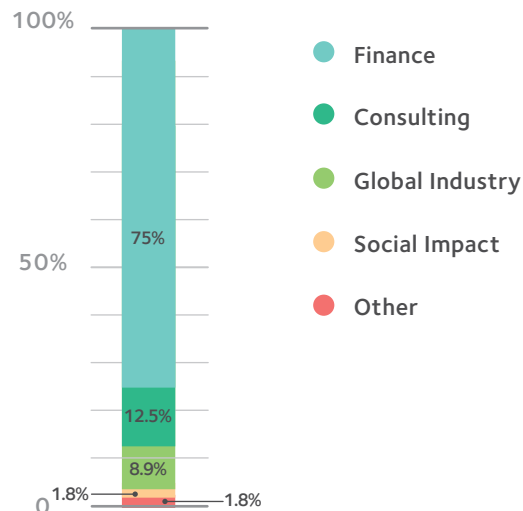

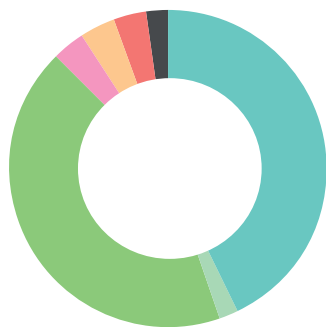
